- *Anonda Bell is a New York and New Jersey based curator and artist. She has a MFA from Monash University (Australia), a Post Graduate Diploma from University of Melbourne (Australia), BFA from RMIT University (Australia) and a BFA from the University of Melbourne (Australia). Her artwork engages notions of human psychology and the motivations, desires and innate qualities of the human mind. She is particularly interested in psychology, feminism and the natural world. Her curatorial practice is currently based at the Paul Robeson Galleries, Rutgers University in Newark. Bell works primarily with contemporary artists from all walks of life, from emerging to established, to outsider. Recent exhibitions curated by Bell have focused on presenting thematically linked works of art offering different perspectives through artworks created in a variety of media.
